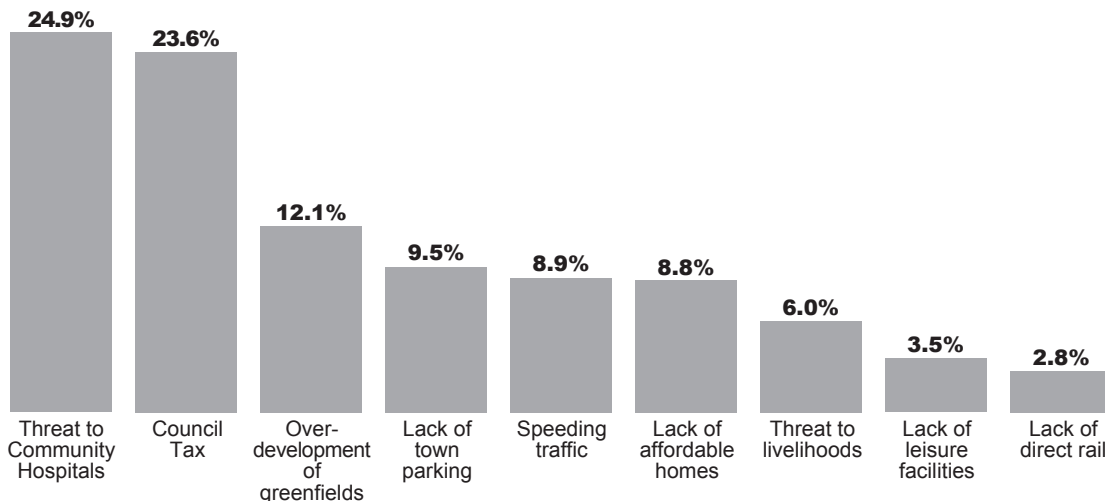


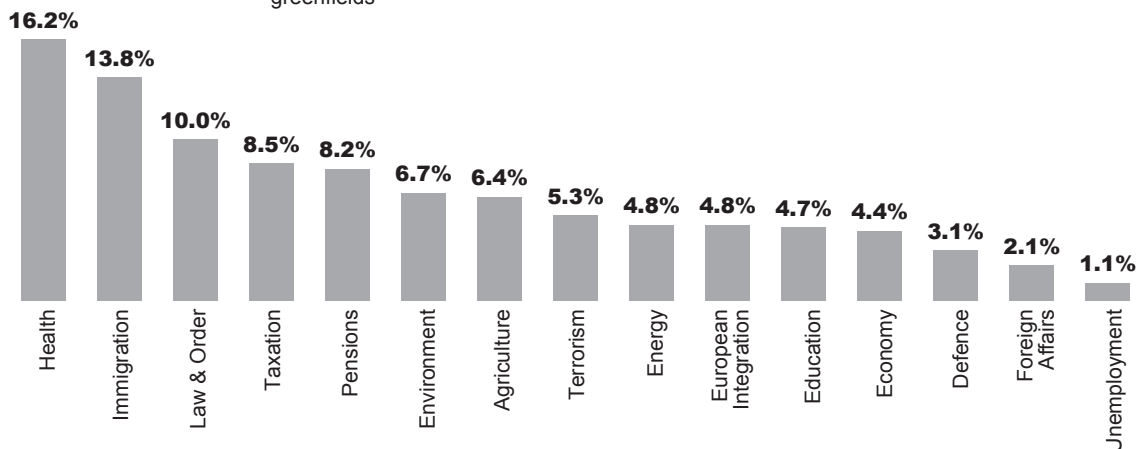

**■ Which LOCAL ISSUES concern you most?**

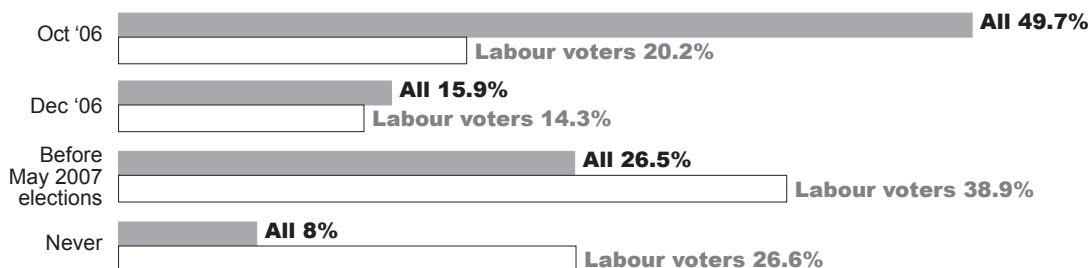


**■ Which NATIONAL ISSUES are of greatest concern to you?**



**■ When should Tony Blair step down as Prime Minister?**

On the issue of when Tony Blair should step down as Prime Minister, an astonishing 73% of Labour voters want to see the back of Mr Blair by this May's local elections.



**■ Who do you think should be the next Labour leader?**

John Reid presents a clear challenge to Gordon Brown as preferred Labour Leader. But amongst Labour voters, Gordon Brown is clear favourite with 62% support and John Reid a poor second with 17%.



**■ Who would make the best Prime Minister?**

A shock result has been the poor showing of Menzies Campbell amongst Lib-Dem voters, less than 20% of whom believe he would make the best Prime Minister, compared with David Cameron (50%) or Gordon Brown (30%).

My survey suggests David Cameron is clearly winning support from both Liberal Democrat and Labour voters. Surprisingly a third of Labour voters preferred Cameron to be PM over Brown.
